Veteran BSN Program Prerequisites

(effective: Nursing Class for Fall 2020)

The FSU College of Nursing admits students for the Traditional track in the Fall semester and Spring semester for the Accelerated track. To be eligible to apply, complete the following nursing prerequisite courses (or their equivalent) prior to entering the nursing program:

* BSC 2010	General Biology for Science Majors	3 Semester Credits
* HUN 1201	Science of Nutrition	3 Semester Credits

* BSC 2086 & Lab	Anatomy & Physiology II and Lab	4 Semester Credits
* MCB 2004 & Lab	General Microbiology and Lab	4 Semester Credits
STA 2XXX	Statistics	3 Semester Credits
DEP2004	Individual & Life Span Development (at FSU FAD3220)	3 Semester Credits
PSY 2012 or	General Psychology	3 Semester Credits
SYG 1000	Introductory Sociology	3 Semester Credits

The Nursing program strongly recommends that applicants complete both a psychology and a sociology course

To be eligible to apply, complete the following nursing prerequisite courses. These courses must be completed at the time of application, with no more than 2 pre-requisites in progress spring of application (lecture and lab count as 1). All prerequisite courses must be completed by the end of the spring semester prior to entering the program in the fall. Science prerequisite courses are indicated below with an asterisk (*). No credits by exam (AP/IB, etc.) will be accepted for science pre-requisite requirements.

- Have earned an overall GPA of at least 3.0
- Have earned an overall science prerequisite GPA of 3.0
- Received at least a B or better in all prerequisite courses.
- **Only** first attempt in all prerequisites will be considered
